## Third and Fourth Grades Focus on Fiction

Third and fourth graders are currently learning about the elements of fiction in reading. This unit coincides with our writing unit where we are creating our very own fiction narratives. We have learned about all of the elements, or parts of a fictional story. We have put a great emphasis on characters and setting.

To develop our characters, we used spinners. Whichever character we landed our spinner on was who or what we needed to create. Some characters from the spinner were identical twins, cranky old man, adventurous young boy, talking bear and many more.

Once we picked a character, we used a different spinner to help us choose the main character's problem in the story. Some examples were that the characters could not read or write, they lost a magic penny, always feel ignored or they are being bullied at school.

Developing our characters was such a super fun activity. The kiddos really enjoyed letting their imaginations flow. The best part of character development was putting their characters to paper and drawing what their imaginations created.



Lastly, we used yet another spinner to help us decide on a setting. Some of the choices were a mountain top, in the jungle, a farm, a school playground and a fancy restaurant. We then organized our plans into a graphic organizer in which the students created the rising action, climax, falling action and resolution.

The third and fourth graders are excited to write their fiction pieces and our goal is make them into our very own books! Be sure to check out their characters and how each student describes their character on the table in the lobby.
