Preparing for the Lord's Supper (Holy Communion)

All who receive the Lord's Supper at this church—members and guests alike—are encouraged to use the following questions as a guide to self-examination in preparation for Holy Communion:

† "Am I a baptized child of the Heavenly Father?"

Acts 2:38-39. Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to Himself."

† "Do I intend, with the Lord's help, to amend my sinful life?"

Galatians 5:22-25. But the fruit of the Spiritis love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit.

† "Have I confessed and repented of my sins?"

Matthew 3:2. "Repent, for the kingdom of

heaven is at hand."

† "Do I trust that Jesus Christ alone is my Savior from sin?"

1 John 1:7. But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin.

"Do I believe that in this Blessed Sacrament (Holy Communion) I am receiving the actual body and blood of Christ, under the bread and wine, for the forgiveness of my sins?"

Matthew 26:26-28. Now as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and after blessing it broke it and gave it to the disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is My body." And He took a cup, and when He had given thanks He gave it to them, saying, "Drink of it, all of you, for this is My blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins."



Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. ²¹Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." ²²And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³If you forgive the sins of anyone, they are forgiven; if you withhold forgiveness from anyone, it is withheld."

²⁴Now Thomas, one of the Twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe."

³⁰Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; ³¹but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.



ILS Kindergarten class is coming alive!...

Amazing things are happening in kindergarten this month!

As part of our Living Things Unit, the children have learned about the 4 things that all living things need to survive: water, sun, food, and air.

We have been busy scientists observing our butterfly and ladybug larvae as they are growing right before our eyes. As of Friday, both the butterfly and ladybug larvae are about to enter the 3rd stage, which is the pupa or chrysalis. We cannot wait for them to emerge!

The children have learned all about their 4 stage life cycles. They are also comparing what is similar and different about each of these insects' life cycles. It is thrilling to see the children as they watch this amazing metamorphosis, and we observe this miraculous transformation firsthand.

In addition to all that excitement, we are also about to plant grass seeds and observe that life cycle as the seed coat opens and the roots grow down, and the stems grow upward! We cannot wait for the grass to grow so tall that we can give it a "haircut"!

The most miraculous growth that has taken place this year is that of the children. I have watched them bloom and grow throughout this wonderful school year. I thank God each day that I have had the opportunity to be a part of their Kindergarten year. I have watched the children grow socially and emotionally, as well as academically.

We have come together every day to pray, play and learn! What a gift it is to teach young minds!
