Preparing for the Lord’s Supper (Holy Communion)

All who receive the Lord’s Supper at this church—members and guests alike—are encouraged to use the following questions as a guide to self-examination in preparation for Holy Communion:

† **“Am I a baptized child of the Heavenly Father?”**

Acts 2:38-39. Peter said to them, “Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off; everyone whom the Lord our God calls to Himself.”

† **“Do I intend, with the Lord’s help, to amend my sinful life?”**

Galatians 5:22-25. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit.

† **“Have I confessed and repented of my sins?”**

Matthew 3:2. “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.”

If, in good conscience, you are unable to affirm the above questions, we invite you to come forward for a blessing. Simply cross your arms in front of you and the pastor or lay minister will offer a blessing to you.

† **“Do I trust that Jesus Christ alone is my Savior from sin?”**

Every Friday, we will be looking for **volunteers** that want to **band together and bag shoe donations**. We will gather outside of the church office at every Friday at **3:15pm**.






